DAY 1



Myths and Breathtaking Vistas

A must-visit stop is the small fishermen's restaurant “Da Pina ai Gechi”.

In the Heart of “Iddu”

Stromboli, affectionately called 'Iddu' by its inhabitants, offers the chance to witness firsthand one of nature's most spectacular expressions of power. You can climb to the top of Strombolicchio to visit its lighthouse, enjoy the volcanic black sand beaches, admire the sunset in the remote village of Ginostra, observe the 'Sciara del Fuoco' up close, and watch the volcano in full activity.

Crystal Clear Waters

Relax in the magnificent anchorages of Panarea, swim and snorkel among the rocks and islets of its unique bays, and visit the prehistoric village of Cala Junco. Our Captain will guide you to discover the lesser-known corners of these islands.

DAY 4

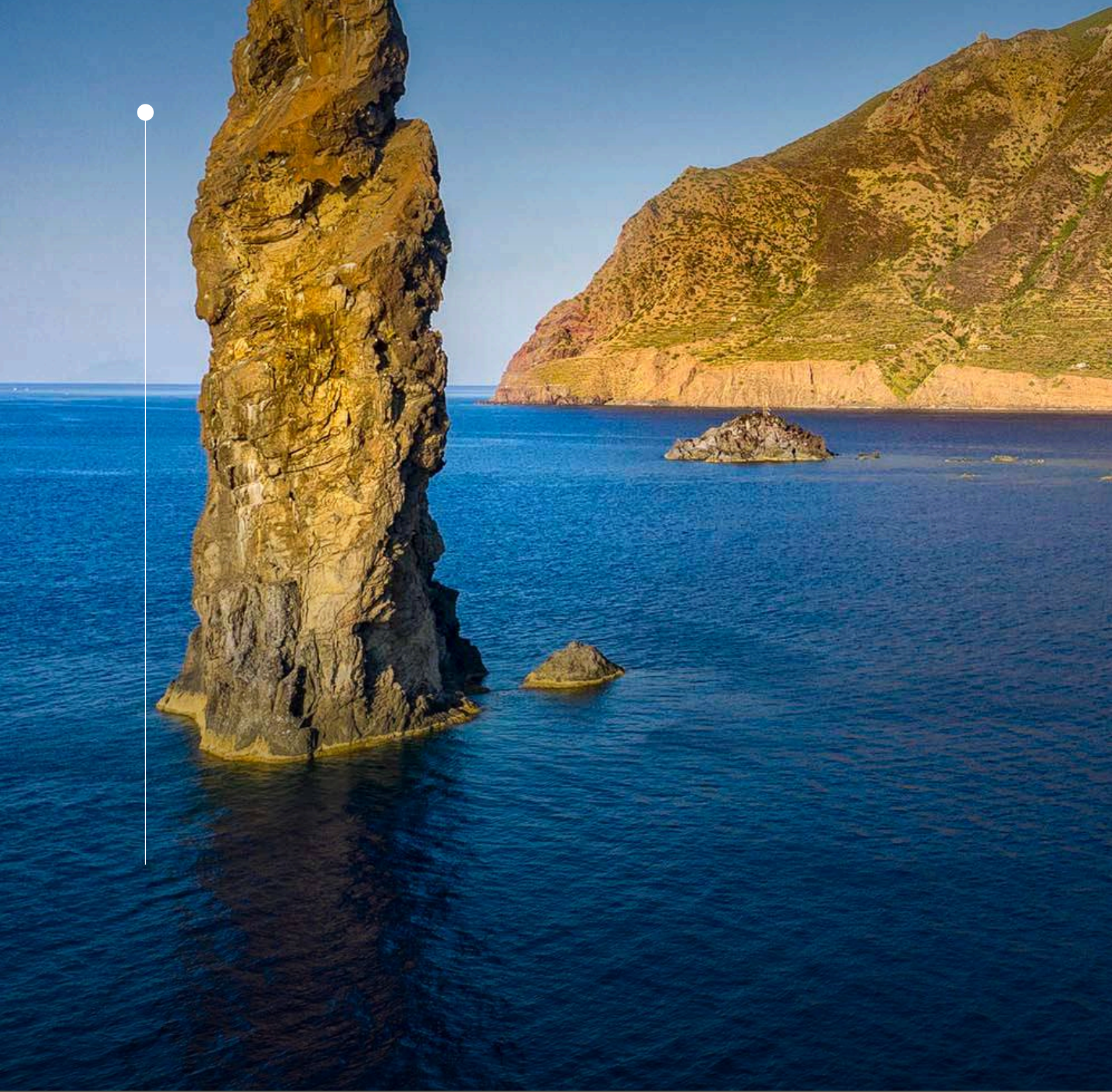


Pollara's Emerald Green

A seaside lunch at Attila's, the 'hermit chef' of Vallemuria, is worth the stop all on its own. Later, Marina Corta, with its vibrant nightlife, reveals the island's other side.
